Mizuki Shigeru Road: Stretching 800 meters from Sakaiminato Station, this street is lined with more than 170 bronze statues of yokai (supernatural monsters) from Shigeru Mizuki's manga series. The road is also home to themed shops and facilities.

Mizuki Shigeru Museum: The museum showcases the life and work of the manga artist, with exhibits on his murals, original prints, and recreations of his work studio.

Yokai Shrine: Found along the Mizuki Shigeru Road, this small shrine also features the yokai theme.

Tsuruga, Japan :- Tsuruga, Japan

Tsuruga is a port city in Fukui Prefecture, Japan, known for its rich history as a crucial transportation hub and its natural beauty. It is located on the Sea of Japan coast, approximately 75 km northeast of Kyoto and 115 km northeast of Osaka

Cultural Sites: Visitors can explore historical sites such as the grand red torii gate of Kehi Shrine (Kehi Jingu), the well-preserved Tsuruga Red Brick Warehouse (which has a large diorama of the historic city), and the Former Tsuruga Port Station Building (Tsuruga Railway Museum).

Fushiki is a historic port district in Takaoka City, Toyama Prefecture, Japan. It is part of the larger Fushiki-Toyama Port, a major port on the Sea of Japan coast.

Fushiki-Toyama Port: A significant port known for handling breakbulk, containers, and bulk cargo, as well as serving as a cruise ship destination.

Historic Architecture: The area has well-preserved historical buildings, such as the Former Akimoto Family House (now a museum), which belonged to a wealthy shipping wholesaler.

Akita is both the name of a prefecture and its capital city, located on the Sea of Japan coast in the northern Tohoku region of Japan. It is known for its heavy snowfall, rich cultural heritage, natural beauty, and local cuisine.

History and Culture: The town of Kakunodate preserves a beautiful and well-maintained samurai district from the Edo Period, offering a glimpse into feudal Japan. The Namahage Museum in Oga offers insights into the local Namahage tradition, where men in ogre masks visit homes on New Year's Eve to warn against laziness.
